Musings from the Manse May 2025

Dear friends,

Writing Musings gives me an excuse to chew over the flavour of church life in the past wee while. Two big things are coming to mind.

One is the opportunities before us. So many things are going well. When I did my first stint as a school pastor last week, I was feeling nervous and also a bit self-conscious in the daft jacket with STREET PASTOR on the back. There were hardly any pupils around – was this really a good idea? The very first person we met asked what we were doing. Then she said quite seriously: "Would you like to take over my life?" She was under pressure and having a bad day. We had a good chat and we will see her again. I walked away from that first encounter utterly convinced that we're doing the right thing here. Many people are keen to engage with us. Teachers, pupils and other staff think it's a great idea and if some pupils' heads go down when they see us coming, that's okay – we'll become a familiar presence very soon.

The cafe is doing well particularly with young mums -17 babies and prams one Tuesday! - and about 6 teenage volunteers from the school to serve. We're doing services in the local nursing homes and I visited

another home outside our town where they would love us to go. The elders have just done their Communion visits and I have several requests to visit people – some of whom haven't been to church in years. And there are events in the community where the Mission team would love us to have a presence – but....

You probably know what the second big thing is – not enough people. Across church life, we can't take up our opportunities because we need more folk. People to visit the elderly and help with nursing home



services. People for the sound and vision rota – and the tea rota – and to help with coffee mornings – and with Sunday morning Kidsteam. One or two more for the Mission team and a convenor for the pastoral care team. A few more cafe volunteers and school pastors. A big need is someone to take on fostering our support for the third world in mission and aid, through TEAR Fund or similar – we badly need to do more of that.

From those thoughts, we're pursuing the possibility of having an SU Gap Year volunteer – see the article on next page. Also, we're starting a Sunday morning series on spiritual gifts and the Church. I don't think its productive for us to twist people's arms into roles they don't really want because they feel guilty or compelled. Rather, I'm asking: what's your gift? What are you passionate about in church life, and how can we foster that? Maybe we have to let go of things we can no longer resource – and maybe take up new things that God is energising us for. That's what we'll be pondering and bringing to God in the coming weeks.

Jesus said, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Pray therefore to the Lord of the harvest, that He will send out workers into His harvest field." If Jesus had that problem, I don't feel so bad – and pray that He will lead the right people to the right roles to equip His church!

A Scripture Union Volunteer for a Year? New possibility for APC!

Sustaining all our varied activities at APC requires the dedicated service of many volunteers. We are delighted that we're being considered as a placement church for a young person who is volunteering to do a gap year with Scripture Union Scotland, starting in September. This is a new Scripture Union possible venture for us and we're keen to take it forward.



What's it about?

SU Scotland has worked in mission and discipleship to Scotland's young people in schools, camps and holiday clubs for over 100 years. To help their ministry, they encourage committed Christian young people to take a year out to work with SU. The gap year is a well-established programme where the young people have placements, as well as training and development opportunities. Usually, the placement is in an SU residential centre or with a Regional Worker. However, occasionally a young person requests a placement in a church which has an active youth ministry. SU is looking for a church placement for one volunteer for a year from this September onwards, and they would like to place her with us.

This feels particularly appropriate since Michelle (our Youth Worker) got started in this ministry many years ago when she did an SU gap year. When I worked for SU, organising gap years was part of my role and that's when I first encountered Michelle. So, anything can happen...!

Who is our possible gap year volunteer?

A 19-year-old girl, currently working as a nursery nurse, has been accepted by SU on to their Gap Year Programme. She will come to visit us for a few days very soon, so that (we can get a feeling for whether this would be a good fit for all of us.) she can meet the APC team and see some of the work we do. This will give all of us chance to see if this might be a good fit.

What would our gap year volunteer do? Three things!

First, to help Michelle and Sandra with our youth and children's work. That means Sunday mornings, school groups, Messy Church, Holiday Club, Sunday evening Holy Space, Friday night youth club, maybe School Pastors, and anything else that comes up. We might even be able to take up new opportunities, depending on her gifts and skills.

Secondly, she would work with Gillian and the others in the Kirk Cafe (church café). The café has six young volunteers from the secondary school, so that counts as youth work, as well as reaching out to the wider community and church family.

Thirdly, she would be part of the worshipping life of our church, participating in worship on Wednesday and Sundays, again according to her gifts – maybe music, reading, children's talks, whatever.

What's required from us?

There is no significant cost. Gap year volunteers raise £4400 for their own support before the start of their year and we're not allowed to pay a salary, though small gifts may be appropriate.

However, we are asked to provide accommodation. Ideally this would be with a host family who can provide board and lodging with a small contribution to offset costs. Alternatively, it may be possible to offer accommodation free of charge and allow her to self-cater.

In Auchterarder, since accommodation may not be within walking distance, we may also have to help with transport.

So, what's next??

After the visit, if we still want the placement to go forward, the biggest need is to find accommodation in the area. Please carefully consider whether you can help with that. If you have any ideas, please contact Lynn.

We hope and pray we can use of this opportunity to help develop a young person's gifts in ministry and (also) enhance the ministry of our own church.



APC Community Garden – May Update – Start of Summer

Communal Garden Fresh Friday and our Veg' Share at the library started at the beginning of the month as our over-winter produce and early season crops matured and we have distributed, leeks, onions, spring green cabbage, lettuce, radish, baby turnips and rhubarb. We were able to start planting our tattie crop in mid-May, but have held off from anything else due to the unseasonal dry and hot weather. However, the recent rain has allowed us to get on and plant out our legumes and brassicas. Thanks to the Auchterarder Horticultural Society for the donation of spare plants from their sale. With all the activity now going on in the garden we have

also increased our composting capacity and have constructed 4 more long awaited storage butts. Our project for the summer is to construct a potager garden (good for people, good for wildlife) in the last remaining


space at the far end of the mini-allotments, with the materials and plants donated by the PKC Biodiversity Programme. If you would like to be involved please get in touch.
