WHAT IS STIR UP SUNDAY?

Musings from the Manse

We're into November, the month which contains "Stir Up Sunday". It's not part of the Presbyterian liturgical calendar (if we have one, I've never found it) but it's celebrated in the Church of England as the Sunday traditionally associated with making Christmas pudding. Faithful Anglicans stir up their puddings that day with the prayer: "Stir up, we beseech thee, O Lord, the wills of thy faithful people; that we, bringing forth the fruit of good works, may of thee be plenteously rewarded."

For me it always recalls an event early in my ministry. I was stuck for a children's talk and realised it was Stir up Sunday, so I collected some fairly random Christmas-pudding type ingredients, got the kids to stir them up in front of the congregation, and told them about being stirred up for God (feeble, I know, but I was desperate!) My plan was to ditch the mess they'd made, buy some Christmas puddings from the Co-op a couple of weeks later, and congratulate them on their success.

I had reckoned without one member, a woman of strong character and stronger views on puddings, who accosted me after the service: "You'll never make a pudding with that!" She was, it transpired, something of an authority on the subject and favoured me with more information than I ever wanted about producing pudding perfection. To prove it, she promised to give me one of hers. Later she did, and she was right – indisputably the best I've ever tasted. And that faithful lady has gifted me with a pudding every single year since, even though I left Eaglesham 10 years ago. Even the worst children's talks can have lasting benefits – thanks be to God!

"Stir up, we beseech thee, O Lord, the wills of Thy faithful people." It's quite a prayer. Maybe we need stirring up, especially if we're getting in a rut with faith or life, if we're feeling lethargic and losing the will to be bothered, or if we've lost any real expectation that things will change. I'm prone to those feelings as much as anyone. However, I've been stirred up recently – by the Prayer Course and the quality of conversations we've had there; by a new role working with ministry

apprentices in our Presbytery; by people I've met in the church café. Maybe we need a good stirring — to "consider how to stir up one another to love and good works". (Hebrews 10:24-25) I hope something in the newsletter stirs you to act, to volunteer, to greater faith and deeper commitment. Enjoy!


There will be singing, a time for prayer, Bible reading and a short reflection.

Communal Garden With the autumn equinox behind us and the temperature dropping, it's definitely time to think about tidying up and putting things 'to bed' for the winter. However, not before we had membrane and bark laid in the Potager garden and the Orchard to keep the weeds down and improve the appearance. We have also been preparing for an early crop next season and have planted onions and

dumping ground but like a butterfly will emerge in the spring as a wildlife friendly area with compost bins, step-over fruit trees, a dry stone wall and a wild flower strip. Keep a look out for progress and you would be very welcome to lend a hand.

Mini-allotments Activity in the 'minis' is dropping off and a couple of beds have already been covered up for the winter. The rest will follow as the holders clear their space and contribute to the compost heap. We have had one bed relinquished recently but it was immediately re-allocated so all 10 remain active. If you know anyone who would value a 'mini' next year 'to grow their own', make sure they get in

It's becoming clear that our vegetable growing enterprise could do with some more ground, more space means more veg' to share. If you have a space in your garden, no matter how big or small, please get in touch if you would be willing to allow us to grow some vegetables there. No need to worry, we will do all the work! Or if you or friends or family would like to learn any aspects of fruit and vegetable growing then please get in touch and we can arrange some sessions.


APC Cycling group


